Solt Haiti Kobonal Mission Collection Results

Recently, Father Meaux visited St. Mary's and shared with us his continued work on the SOLT Kobonal Mission in Haiti. The mission currently has 1,000 students enrolled and has been a partner in educating 20,000 children since being built.

The mission supports 14 villages and gives hope and safety while cultivating community among the poorest of the poor. The mission also provides clean water, housing, develops permaculture as well as grows crops and cultivates other vegetation for villagers.

For each student enrolled in the school, it is Father Meaux's goal to provide 1 goat. This goat becomes a family's savings account, providing nutrition and a means of income through the sales of any baby goats birthed. This can in turn pay for education, food, clothing, or other needs. As in the past, St. Mary's students have partnered with Father Meaux to provide funds to be used in the purchase of goats for the mission. Each goat costs \$80 and we were able to raise \$1,230 to purchase 15 goats total.
