COVID-19 Symptoms and When to Get Tested

Flu season is upon us and it seems a good time to review the symptoms of COVID-19 and discuss when to get tested.

The most common symptoms of COVID-19 are: fever or chills, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, fatigue, muscle or body aches, headache, new loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting or diarrhea. Many of these symptoms are similar to that of the flu.

When to get tested for COVID-19—When you have been exposed to someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 or when you have symptoms of COVID-19. Contact your Primary Care Physician for more information.
