It is our promise to each of our families that we will do everything in our power to keep your children safe while they are in our care, and I felt it was a necessary step towards keeping that promise.

We are thirteen days into the new school year, so long enough that there should be grades in every subject. Please check grades online and if there are any questions, talk to your kiddos and/or their teachers to make sure home and school are working together as effectively as possible. The middle school teachers have worked to revise the late work policy so as to be more fair to the students while still holding each accountable. The new policy should have been part of the classroom discussions at Back to School Night. Please review the policy in the Parent/Student Handbook. If you have a middle school student, it is very important that you check grades regularly. Teachers will do their best to post any missing assignment on the day it was due, and students will have 48 hours to complete any missing assignment. Our goal is to make it more worthwhile for students to complete any missing assignment in a timely manner and to lighten the burden on teachers trying to keep track of missing assignments.

We have four volleyball teams registered for the season and games have begun. Information regarding basketball sign ups will be out in the next week. The school physicals, required for students in the odd numbered grades will suffice for DMSAA (Diocesan Middle School Athletic Association) required sports physicals. Middle school students in 6th and 8th grade will need physicals to be able to practice and participate in basketball and track. We should have had these physicals on file for cross country and volleyball. I was operating under the erroneous assumption that this had been communicated in the spring. It is too late for these to be collected for volleyball and cross country, but we must be in compliance for the remaining sports. DMSAA forms can be found on the school website.

Progress reports for the first quarter will go home on Monday, September 18th and the window for the first round of MAPs testing will be September 18th through September 29th.


